- Explain why balancing security and individual rights is important;
- Guide a discussion on case studies of rights violations in corrections facilities.

- Analyze real-life case scenarios on legal challenges in penitentiaries;
- Reflect on scenario questions and propose best response approaches.

- *Discuss the legal and ethical considerations for vulnerable groups (juveniles, mentally ill inmates, and others at risk) in managing crisis situations.*

Learners' Actions:

- *Participate in group discussions;*

- *Draft an emergency response plan;*
- *Reflect on case study example of a prison riot;*
- *Reflect on scenario questions and propose best response approaches for addressing the needs of vulnerable groups.*

Unit 6: Rehabilitation and Reintegration Laws and Procedures

Instructor's Actions:

- *Discuss the types of rehabilitation programmes (Educational and literacy programs; Vocational training and skill-building; Psychological counseling and substance abuse rehabilitation);*
- *Analyse the importance of individualized assessments and plans;*
- *Discuss the legal framework for reintegration (Parole eligibility and conditions; Early release programs and their criteria; Support services mandated by law (e.g., housing, employment assistance));*
- *Critically assess reintegration challenges such as stigma, skill gaps, and community acceptance.*
- *Present legal strategies for overcoming these barriers;*
- *Facilitate a brainstorming session.*
